

Happy July, Calvary Family!

I write to you from vacation as my family and I figure out how to have some adventures while also still staying socially isolated. While we didn't get to go camping, we are going up to Lake Tahoe next week for the final week of vacation. Camp Galilee is booking day adventures for families on the weekends, but is largely empty during the week, so they invited us to come and enjoy a cabin with small kitchen and to enjoy the lake and water trampoline. We did manage to get a socially-distanced visit with my chosen-brother Airon to see the kids, share our puppy with them (he needs socialization so he doesn't grow up overly skittish of strangers), and had the boys' favorite In 'N Out for dinner.

Now in our fourth month of quarantine and nearly a month into summer vacation for the kids, some new patterns of normalcy have begun to routinize—the case for many of us as we adapt and become more adept at navigating this changing and strange new world. Reflecting on God's promise of accompaniment, love, presence, forgiveness, and help in the Holy Spirit, I can't help but be so incredibly thankful for a faith that brings awareness of God's presence in highs, lows, transitions, new beginnings, endings, and everywhere in between.

Outreach Sunday, July 26. Each month we focus on a Calvary outreach ministry and collect a special offering for that ministry. Calvary is a founding member of the Association of Faith Communities of Santa Cruz County and administered the Association programs as a Calvary ministry from 2011 through December 1, 2016. That Association operates the Faith Community Shelter, the Santa Cruz County Winter Emergency Shelter, the (SPIN) sock program, the Veteran's Shared Housing Program, and an online Resource Directory for people in need. As a member church in AFCSC, Calvary also hosts the Faith Community Shelter, housing up to 20 people one night each week. Learn, Pray, Act. That's what The Episcopal Church calls us to do as we confront racism in our society and become beloved community. Treasurer's Report

The May Income Statement is as we expected. We continue to take big hits on 12-Step Income and Facility Rental Income and are currently just over (\$10,000) in combined budget deficits for these two accounts year-to-date. Pledge income slipped a bit in May, coming in at (\$2500) under budget, but we are \$7900 over budget year-to-date, so it's not a worry at this point. Plate is holding steady at just \$100 over budget year-to-date. Our Total Operating Income came in at (\$6,000) under budget for the month of May and (\$4000) under budget year-to-date.

There were no surprises on the expense side of the Income Statement. Total Administrative Expenses are just about at budget: (\$365) under for the month of May and (\$660) year-to-date. Under budget is good when it comes to expenses, so we can be pleased with the expense side of the budget.

Our Net Operating Income for May is (\$3800) and \$698 to the good year-to-date. But remember, we are working on a deficit budget of (\$4531), so being only \$700 over budget year-to-date is cause for concern. However, the Paycheck Protection Program Ioan we received from the government should go a long ways towards alleviating the deficit. We will be applying to have the Ioan of \$39,000 forgiven in the next couple of months. According to my understanding of the program, we should have no problem converting the Ioan into a grant.

On the Balance Sheet, our trust fund continues its recovery from the big crash in March. We are up another \$2744 as of May 31st. We have \$5886 left of Green Initiative funds. The Paycheck Protection Program Ioan funds are not yet reflected on the Balance Sheet. We received the check but are waiting to deposit it until we have a checking account open solely for those funds. That should be accomplished soon and will show up on our June Balance Sheet.
