

October Message The Rev. Dr. Austin L. Leininger



Welcome to October, Calvary family!

I toyed with the idea of saying "in year-one of the covidera," but I decided that a tongue-in-cheek greeting isn't what I was going for in the salutation . And yet, this is the reality and the world in which we live—we aren't certain when restrictions will lift, or, when they do, when it will even actually be safe to congregate, to hug each other, to be in physically-present community again. The uncertainty can be exhausting, it has been a grieving process, it has been a period of intense change that has forced us to be flexible in ways many of us never imagined, and yet we are here.

We remain as a community connected to each other, invested in each other's lives, and seeking ways to live out our faith and God's abundance in our pandemic world. We have housed each other when displaced by fires, we have supported one another in grief and confusion, we have helped one another through financial hardship, we have reached out each week to call each other, we have worried about each other's safety and wellbeing, we have gathered together online to build new bridges to one another when the familiar roads and paths have been cut-off, and we have maintained our pledges that keep Calvary functional as a parish. creates picture of our collective response out of faith and love! This is the response of being present in and ambassadors of God's abundance in relationship with each other. It is the response of hope in the face of uncertainty and grief. It is the response of resilience and perseverance. We often hear about what the "kingdom of heaven" (or "socialist egalitarian commonwealth of heaven" for those less monarchically minded) is like, and, for many of us, the experience of our community coming together in this time is an amazing example of just that.

In the past, October has been the month in which we've celebrated St. Francis Day with the blessing of the animals. It has been the month when we've started our pledge drive for the coming year. It has been the month when we've welcomed trick-or-treaters to Calvary for the downtown celebration of Halloween, the month we've celebrated Dia de los Muertos and prepared for All Saints Day. And for once this year, I'm glad to be able to say that, despite our world being in confusion, and our norms confounded, we yet continue our celebrations and planning! We'll gather virtually to bless the animals on Sunday the 4th at our coffee hour. Adding something new this month, we'll be kicking off our 9:00 worship/adult ed hour on October 11th. We'll find new traditions and ways of celebrating Halloween with our children and neighbors—and to that end, we'll be inviting each family who is so inclined to set up an ofrenda to share at our Coffee Hour on All Saints Day (which is on a Sunday this year!). And on October 17th, we'll gather virtually (on Zoom) at 4 in the afternoon for fellowship and festive refreshments to celebrate our past year in ministry and plan for next year's ministry at the kick off to our 2021 pledge drive!

The faithfulness, hope, care, versatility, flexibility, creativity, ingenuity, and indomitable spirit of our Calvary community is an example and a beacon of hope to those in our neighboring communities. 



Treasurer's Report

Our August 2020 Income Statement remains true to course in this time of pandemic and quarantine: overall income is down (\$10,000.00) year-to-date mostly due to lack of 12-step and facility rental income. This month pledge income slipped a bit in comparison to our budgeted amount. We are under budget (\$2800.00) in August pledge income but still up \$7700.00 in pledge income year-to-date. Plate income is holding very steady every month, being only (\$87.00) under budget year-to-date.

Our expenses help by generally being under budget every month. This is due in large part to the lack of activity at church. Our new solar panels also play a big role in keeping costs down. The gas and electric bill is down (\$1200.00) year to date. Overall, our operating expenses are down (\$10,000.00) year to date, which puts us just about at budget as of the end of August.

We are working with a deficit budget of (\$4500.00), so we do have some ground to make up. This is a concern for the upcoming months, as our budget was adopted previous to the pandemic and we budgeted for a big uptick in pledges during the month of December. It's been historically true that the Christmas programs help make December our biggest pledge and plate income month. This year we expect to still be "worshiping in place" during the Christmas season, so let's hope the Christmas spirit as well as our online Christmas programs will prompt generous giving despite our different circumstances!
