

TODAY'S MUSIC

Christ the King, the last Sunday of the Church Year, brings us more grand and well-loved hymns than can be fit into one service. If your favorite hymn got left out, tell me and I will make a note for next year. Our anthem is an inventive setting of a popular hymn by the early twentieth century German composer, Hugo Distler. By 1940 Distler had risen to become a major musical figure in Germany, leading the prestigious *Stats- und Berliner Dom Chor*, dating from 1465 and considered to be the oldest musical institution in Berlin. Aerial attacks, the threat of conscription into the German army, deaths of friends, and restrictions placed upon his work by the Nazi regime, all led to his death by suicide at age 34.


